

**CHECKLIST FOR RENEWAL OF EXTENSION OF STAY  
USING 800,000 BAHT ON DEPOSIT IN A THAI BANK METHOD**

- TM.7 Application for Extension of Stay
  - Photograph (Available at shop next to Immigration)
  - Original – Passport
  - Photo Copy of passport<sup>1</sup>
    - Identification page
    - Non-Immigrant Visa
    - All Extensions of Stay stamps
    - Latest entry into Thailand stamp
  - Photo Copy of TM.6 Departure Card
  
  - Original – latest Bank Passbook(s) for the following period that photocopies are required (on day of application – do an ATM transaction and update passbook)
  - Photo Copy of Bank Passbook if renewing extension showing pages for the preceding 12 months prior to application date (the passbook will need to show that the balance has been:
    - At least 800,000 baht for 2 preceding months
    - At least 800,000 baht for the 3 months after date of last renewal application
    - At least 400,000 baht for the remaining 7 months
- OR
- Photo Copy of Bank Passbook if initial application showing at least 800,000 baht has been on deposit for the preceding 2 months.
  - Original - Bank Letter attesting to Name and Account Number for the Bank Account – dated on the day of application or, if applying early in the morning, the previous day
  - **ONLY IF UNDERLYING VISA** was a Non-Immigrant “OA” – Letter from Thai health insurance company on TGIA Listing as evidence of having required health insurance – coverage should coincide with the beginning date of the extension period.
  - Copy(ies) of Proof of Residence documents (Rental Agreement, Housebook, Company documents if Company owned, etc.)<sup>2</sup>
  - Extension Fee – 1,900 Baht

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<sup>1</sup> If using a newer passport, copies of the pages showing Immigration transfer stamps and subsequent extension stamps if applicable.

<sup>2</sup> There have been some reports that a current Thai Driving License showing current address has been accepted (address is on reverse side), but will depend on Immigration Officer taking the application. In the case of a rental agreement, they may also want to see copy of Thai owner ID (or non-Thai's passport identity page) and a copy of owner's housebook for the property.
